MINUTES

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE WILLIAM PATERSON UNIVERSITY OF NEW JERSEY

Friday, September 24, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. in the College Hall Board Room. Trustees were both in attendance and participating via virtual platforms due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

At approximately 10:47 a.m., the Public Session resumed.

It was moved by Mr. Lenahan and seconded by Ms. McDowell to adopt the following resolution:

APPROVAL OF MINUTES JUNE 10, 2021, BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING:

The minutes of the June 10, 2021, Board Meeting were approved as distributed.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Chair Seeve welcomed everyone to the in-person and virtual meeting and explained that many agenda items had been discussed at the Committee meetings held on September 9, 2021. Mr. Seeve stated that the President had informed him of the positive feedback received from faculty, staff, and students, for being back on campus. He also commented that the Board continuously

monitors the enrollment and budget challenges facing the University and stated that the Board remains confident in the leadership of the President and Cabinet members during this difficult time.

Mr. Seeve then welcomed two new trustee members, Ms. Audrey McDowell and Ms. Idida Rodriguez and provided a brief background on each of them. Mr. Seeve then joined President Helldobler and Vice President de Veyga at the front of the room, as General Counsel Reardon Henry administered the Oath of Office to each of them. Board members congratulated the newest Trustees and welcomed them to the Board.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Helldobler began his report by highlighting a few of the University's achievements. He stated that US News and World Report Best Colleges Report included a list of top performers on social mobility. He stated that in this report, William Paterson University is ranked 26th, up from last year's 38th, and the University is also tied for 6th in the North Regional category in terms of Campus Ethnic Diversity. President Helldobler mentioned that William Paterson retained its 2021 ranking of 90th in the category of Best Regional Universities - North. The President also informed the Board that the University recently received a \$4.9M grant from ASPIRE, the Access to STEM Pathways through Integrated Research and Engagement. He stated that the grant would target first-time firstyear Hispanic and low-income students and Passaic County Community College students. The President thanked Provost Powers, VP de Veyga, Dean Sharma and Associate Dean Zeleke, in the College of Science and Health, Associate Provost Hill, and Mr. Patrick Noonan, Director of Transfer Programs and Special Sessions, for their work on the grant application. President Helldobler briefly spoke of his State of the University Address on September 2 where he provided an update on the University's Strategic Plan. The President mentioned that audience members, both in-person and virtually, were able to participate in a polling exercise about the potential new direction for the WP brand identity. He stated that he recognizes the significant enrollment and budget challenges the University faces going forward and that a plan will be presented to the Board at the November meeting.

President Helldobler's written report is included in the Board Materials, and is incorporated into the minutes of this meeting.

PRELIMINARY CENSUS FOR FALL 2021

Vice President Ross reviewed his enrollment report and stated that overall headcount was at 9,497 students with a 67.5% first-year retention rate for Fall 2021. He mentioned that the University is down 16.4% this year from last year in the black student population and even if the overall headcount goal is achieved, it is unlikely that the budget goal would be met. Of the 710 students who were de-registered for vaccine non-compliance, 375 (52.8%) have re-registered, and 335 have not re-registered. Approximately 120 students, many of whom were part of the non-vaccinated group, were dropped for non-payment. There were on-going campaigns to re-register the non-payment group throughout the summer. The campaign to register the students dropped for vaccine non-compliance will begin in October as we near the spring registration window. He briefly mentioned a national report that was published on June 9 that spoke of an 11.4% national drop in high-school graduates from high-poverty high schools. Dr. Ross stated that the report also spoke of the challenges that students were facing, including financial insecurity and mental health challenges. President Helldobler reported that he spoke with AASCU Presidents on a recent call and the enrollment and fiscal challenges seem to be happening across the country. Trustee

Zastocki asked about students utilizing the writing centers on campus and the President stated that this is a requirement for students in 1000 level courses.

WP ONLINE: ACADEMIC PARTNERSHIPS UDPATE

Provost Powers introduced Mr. Chris Chiodo, from Academic Partnerships for an update presentation. Mr. Chiodo reviewed where enrollments were coming from and how enrollments were acquired at the high-school level, as well as the online student. He noted that between July and September 2021, there was a dramatic growth in enrolled students in the RN to BSN nursing program, increasing from 19 to 135 and that Associate Provost Lincoln, as well as the nursing department, would be assisting with the support of these new students. Mr. Chiodo continued with his presentation by briefly speaking of where inquiries were coming from and broke down information on enrollments. He stated that between January and May 2021. 18 million impressions were made that generated 5,600 leads. Mr. Chiodo mentioned that of the 5,600 leads, 3,500 contacts were made, where agents actually spoke to, texted, or emailed back and forth with potential applicants. He reported that 1,300 applications where received, which resulted in 656 new enrollments for that time period. Mr. Chiodo explained how the Academic Partnerships system works and that the incoming cohort of undergrad students beginning on November 1 would require more attention and team members dedicated to student support. He provided information about the online student and stated that many applicants view cost as very important, along with accelerated time to completion, credit for career experience, quality-accredited programs with multiple start dates, and career relevance. Trustee Neilley inquired about whether or not the support of Academic Partnership representatives spans a student's academic career. Mr. Chiodo responded by stating that each student will be followed throughout their academic journey and through to graduation. Trustee Seeve and Provost Powers thanked Mr. Chiodo for his presentation and efforts.

UNIVERSITY STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

President Helldober and VP de Veyga gave a brief update presentation on the University's Strategic Plan. VP de Veyga stated that a survey had gone out to 777 staff members asking what they felt were critical topics for the University's Strategic Plan and currently 163 people had responded or 22% of the population. He mentioned that the number one priority identified by the staff was diversification of our enrollment strategies and streams, the second was identifying alternate sources of revenue, and the third was decolonizing the University's curriculum. VP de Veyga stated that the survey was recently distributed to other members of the University community including, full and part-time faculty, students, and our alumni board. He reported that these survey results would be compiled in the next two weeks, so smaller groups could be formed to fine-tune the topics further.

The President shared the polling exercise done at the State of the University address on September 2 and described the results of two prototypes introduced to attendees. He explained the first prototype, WP "You", which is a high-tech, high-touch, tech savvy institution that focuses more on software to help students navigate campus processes and create more app-based solutions. The President stated that the second prototype, WP-Specific, was more of a discipline-focused, career outcome institution, with more internships and research-based opportunities. He briefly detailed the polling results received after asking which prototype was most preferred and stated that this was just the beginning of where we are in the branding and identity conversation. Trustee Rodriguez commented that she was excited to see how this process transpires and she

thought "out of the box" ideas could create a greater interest for a new student population. The President reported that he would review all of the survey data and present a plan to the Board in November to assess these priorities.

MIDDLE STATES COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION UPDATE:

Chair Seeve asked Associate Provost Lincoln to give an update on the status of the Middle States Commission on Higher Education reaccreditation process. Dr. Lincoln briefly stated that the University's accreditation for the next eight-year cycle was reaffirmed. Dr. Lincoln commented that there were three recommendations given to the University and most are around newer processes that had been implemented in the last three years. He reported that more robust assessments are being worked on across divisions and an update report would need to be provided one-year later to document that the University has fulfilled its obligations. Dr. Lincoln informed Board members that the USDOE is requiring a follow-up site visit for those schools that had gone through the reaccreditation process virtually. He stated that he is awaiting more information, as MSCHE is still operating remotely.

GOVERNMENT AND COMMUNITY AFFAIRS REPORT:

Vice President de Veyga provided his Government Affairs report as part of the Board materials. Dr. de Veyga briefly answered questions about the Gubernatorial Debate and was disappointed that WPU was not chosen this election cycle. He also indicated that he was closely monitoring the bills during the lame duck session.

FINANCE, AUDIT AND INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mr. Lenahan reported that the Finance, Audit and Institutional Development Committee met on September 9, 2021.

Committee members heard a report from VP Ross regarding the preliminary census numbers for Fall 2021. Dr. Ross informed Committee members that the University headcount is down 2.9% from last year with a notable decline in full-time undergraduate students by 12%. During the Committee meeting, he also reviewed a national report published in June detailing an 11.4% drop in high-school graduates from high-poverty high schools. Dr. Ross told the Committee that the report also found that more students were dealing with financial insecurity and mental health challenges.

Associate Vice President, Finance and CFOGreen and Mr. Tim Lever, Director of University Budget and Planning, began their report to the Committee by presenting a new format for an All Funds Report that provides greater transparency and better reflects University revenues and expenses. AVP Green informed the Committee that government funds received were credited to Fiscal Year 2021 and would not help offset the decline in full-time enrollments for Fiscal Year 2022. She reported to Committee members that this decline would result in an expected deficit of \$8M for the Fall and with conservative projections, a \$17M deficit for the Spring, and that this would need to be addressed. AVP Green reviewed the capital projects and budgets with the Committee and presented a resolution in this regard.

The following resolution was recommended for approval by the Board:

The Committee then received a brief update from AVP Green on the re-scoping of the 2021C bond proceeds. Trustee Lenahan informed Board members that due to Committee discussions and the need to delay some proposed projects, specifically the Carriage House and Field House, the bond re-scoping motion would need to be tabled. Mr. Lenahan stated that there needed to be more clarity on capital projects and how those funds would be expended in the future for Fiscal Years 2023 and 2024.

Vice President Ferguson informed the Committee of the highlights from Fiscal Year 2021 and an update on activities for the current fiscal year. She told Committee members that her division raised \$3.9M in new cash and commitments and noted the estate gift of \$5.93M from Barbara Moll Grant. VP Ferguson then brought a resolution forward to the Committee, for the naming of the University tennis courts after Dr. Ginny Overdorf, Professor Emerita.

The following resolution was recommended for approval by the Board:

Trustee Lenahan reported that CIO Eric Rosenberg briefed the Committee on the cyber security report.

EDUCATIONAL POLICY AND STUDENT DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REPORT:

Trustee Pesce discussed the Committee meeting that was held on September 9, 2021. He stated that the Committee heard a brief update from VP Ross on enrollment and from Associate Provosts Drs. Hill and Lincoln on the University's status with Middle States Commission on Higher Education. The Committee then received a presentation from Dr. Eileen Lubeck, Dean of Students, on the utilization of the Counseling, Health, and Wellness Center (CHWC) and its services to students. Dr. Lubeck informed Committee members that there was a quick pivot to telehealth appointments during the pandemic when students could not meet in-person and 93% of survey respondents indicated that the care they received from counselors positively affected their overall feeling of belonging.

Trustee Pesce commented he felt it was important that Board members review the national report that VP Ross circulated and that the survey conducted by the CHWC was indicative of what is happening with COVID-19. He stated that he did not think this was a short-term challenge and that what we do is important and how we do it, is equally important.

PERSONNEL AND COMPENSATION COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mr. Neilley reported that the Personnel and Compensation Committee met on September 9, 2021, to review personnel matters brought forth by the administration subsequent to the June 10, 2021, Board Meeting. At the Committee meeting, Board members and Cabinet members were included in discussions regarding the next round of layoffs with notifications in mid-November effective January 2022. Ms. Annette Baron, Talent Acquisition and Learning and Development, and Dr. David Jones, Chief Diversity Officer, provided a brief presentation on the summer 2021 professional development program. General Counsel Reardon Henry discussed ongoing litigation matters.

The following resolutions were recommended for approval by the Board:

NOMINATIONS AND GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Galandak reported that the Nominations and Governance Committee met on September 9, 2021. During the Committee meeting, he discussed welcoming the two new Board members, Ms. Idida Rodriguez and Ms. Audrey McDowell. Chief of Staff Mc Laughlin Vignier briefed Committee members on the Board Retreat and stated that the ideas from EAB were the primary focus of President Helldobler's State of the University Address. She told the Committee that polling would continue throughout the Fall semester with various stakeholders on campus in order to land on a vision and brand identity.

Trustee Galandak then told the Board that due to State statute, the Board needed to elect officers each September. The Committee agreed to suggest to the full Board that the current officers remain in place for another year. During the Board meeting, a vote was taken by closed ballot for each individual position. In a unanimous vote, all current Board officers were elected to remain in their current positions until September 2022.

Trustee Galandak informed Board members that the Committee planned to present a motion at the Board of Trustees meeting in November to change the bylaws, adding the Board Secretary to the Executive Committee of the Board.

OTHER BUSINESS

There being no further business, a motion was made to adjourn the meeting. It was moved and seconded and the meeting was adjourned at 12:34 p.m.
